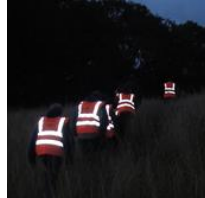


Coming to a field near you ... the badger cull

During the 2013 to 2016 culls many badgers were wounded and died slow and painful deaths. The government's own Independent Expert Panel concluded that the cull is both inhumane & ineffective. Despite this, the cull is continuing in 2017 as well as expanding into new areas. This is without any independent monitoring and despite the British Veterinary Association withdrawing support for free shooting. We want to see an end to bovine TB and the suffering it causes. However, wasting £7,000 per badger shot in a futile cull, proven to have no effect on bTB, is uneconomic, unscientific and unsustainable.

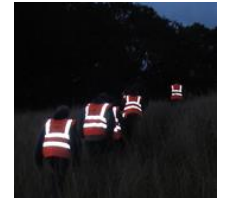
